FLU SEASON 2020

Flu Clinic: Saturday 10th October at Circuit Lane Surgery for Patients 65 Years and Over and chronic diseases. Please contact the surgery to book. If you are unable to attend on 10th October, watch out for postings of new dates in due course across both surgeries. They will be added daily as and when we are in receipt of our deliveries of vaccine so that we are sure to be able to deliver.

Please note that people in the 50-64-year old age group who do not have a chronic disease will not be vaccinated until November and December, providing there is sufficient vaccine. No appointments will be offered for this age group until then. This is to ensure that those who are most at risk are vaccinated first. If you are 50-64 and you are in one of the other groups which is eligible for the flu vaccination, for example you have a health condition which puts you at risk from the flu, you will be invited earlier.

Children's nasal flu's are always given in October so please wait for further information.

We offer flu immunisations for all eligible patients:

- Anyone Over the age of 65 Years
- Pregnant
- Diabetic
- Have a long-term condition that affects:

Lungs – e.g. asthma or COPD

Heart – ischaemic heart disease or angina

Brain or nervous system - stroke or TIA

Kidneys - CKD

Liver – cirrhosis or hepatitis

Immune System – immunocompromised due to disease or medication

Spleen – splenectomy

We are unable to hold the clinic in our usual way due to social distancing, however, we will be seeing a very large number of patients in a very short period of time so please ar-

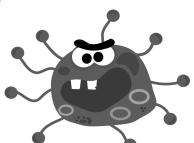
